Introduction

The purpose of this referral guide is to offer a list of health care providers and health care facilities that provide the outpatient medical services you may need for medical follow-up care outside of your participation in the HANDLS study. It describes non-profit and governmental resources available to provide services to individuals with health insurance, medical assistance, lower income, and/or uninsured residents of the Baltimore area. The guide is not intended to list all available programs, but rather *major* programs that provide primary health care, pharmacy assistance, hotlines, HIV screening, literacy/GED programs, mental health and substance abuse treatment programs. Some of the programs listed will accept Medicare, medical assistance and/or private insurance.

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Getting Health Insurance Benefits

What is Maryland Health Connection?

Maryland Health Connection is for all Marylanders who need health insurance. It is Maryland's official health insurance marketplace where you can shop, compare and enroll in quality health and dental insurance that fits your needs and your budget.

What makes coverage through Maryland Health Connection more affordable?

Maryland Health Connection is the only place you can get financial help to lower the cost of health insurance. Nine in 10 Marylanders who enrolled last year qualified for financial help. Depending on your income and family size, you may qualify for tax credits that lower your monthly premium and for lower out-of-pocket costs like deductibles and copays. Or, you may qualify for free or low-cost coverage through Medicaid or Maryland Children's Health Program. Check out the chart below to see what you might qualify for. If you're pregnant or you have children, you may still qualify even if your income is higher.

Am I required to have health insurance?

By law, most adults must have health insurance or pay a fine when they file their taxes.

If you have coverage through your employer, Medicaid or Medicare, you meet the insurance requirement. Some people are exempt and don't have to pay a penalty for not having coverage, such as those who cannot afford coverage or have a religious objection.

What has changed in 2018?

For now, here's what you need to know:

- The recent reduction in federal funding for the federal navigator program does not pertain to Maryland. Maryland Health Connection is a state-based marketplace. Therefore, the funding that supports our navigator program has been maintained for navigators, who provide help for enrollment into free and low-cost health coverage and private health plans. For more information about how to find a navigator or for assistance with your application see below under the heading "How to enroll for coverage in 2019".
- **Open enrollment for 2018 health and dental plans ended Dec. 22, 2017.** Nine out of 10 people who enrolled qualified for lower costs.
- ***Open enrollment for 2019 health and dental plans begins Nov. 1, 2018 and ends Dec. 15, 2018.***
- Even if you're already enrolled, it's more important to go back each year to browse plan prices to make sure you're getting the best deal for you and your family.
- Most Marylanders receiving financial help will not see an increase in their monthly costs, even if their plan's premium went up this year. In fact, some people who previously would not have qualified for financial help will now qualify for a tax credit to help lower their costs.
- It is important for Marylanders to understand that the Affordable Care Act (ACA) is still the law of the land, and you may still pay a penalty for not having health insurance through Dec. 31, 2018.
- If you signed up for health insurance for 2018, your coverage is protected through the end of this year. Make sure you stay covered throughout the year by continuing to pay your premium on time.

- Maryland Health Connection continues to help eligible people enroll year-round – including those who have recently experienced certain life events like losing their job, getting married or divorced, or having a baby.
- If you are eligible for Medicaid or Maryland Children's Health Insurance Program (MCHP), you can enroll any time.

How to enroll for health insurance coverage for 2019

Maryland Health Connection is designed to help you find health insurance that meets your needs and fits your budget. You may be eligible for financial help that can lower your monthly premium for free or low-cost coverage through Medicaid. To find out you will need to apply through Maryland Health Connection. You must apply during the open enrollment period for 2019. **Open enrollment for 2019 health and dental plans begins Nov. 1, 2018 and ends Dec. 15, 2018.**

What documents will I need to apply:

Use the checklist below to get ready to apply:

- Social Security numbers (or document numbers for any legal immigrants who need insurance)
- Birthdates and general information about you and your family members who are also applying for health coverage
- Policy numbers for any current health insurance
- Employer and income information for everyone in your family (for example, from paystubs, W-2 forms or wage and tax statements)
- Information about any job-related health insurance available to your family

Having these documents available will make the process go much quicker. Be prepared by having them nearby when you complete your application.

* Remember if you have a qualifying life event or if you are eligible for Medicaid, you can apply anytime

Pharmacy Assistance in Maryland

Below are a several ways to get assistance paying for prescriptions in Maryland that are not covered by your health insurance plan, Medicare part D and/or Medicaid.

Maryland Prescription Plan – Prescription Assistance Program (PAP)

As a resident of **Maryland**, you and your family have access to a statewide Prescription Assistance Program (PAP). Create and print your discount prescription drug card coupon here: <https://www.marylandrxcard.com/>. This pharmacy coupon card will provide you with Rx medication **savings of up to 75%** at more than 68,000 pharmacies across the country including **CVS/pharmacy, Albertsons, Walgreens, Stop & Shop, Giant, Safeway, Rite Aid, Kmart**, and many more. You can create as many coupons as you need. You can create and send them to friends and family members via one of the many available options. **This Coupon/Card is pre-activated and can be used immediately!**

- **Free For Everyone.** All residents are eligible to get pharmacy discounts through this program. The program may be used to provide savings on prescriptions not covered by your health insurance or Medicare Part D. The program may also be used instead of your insurance coverage when it offers greater savings than your copay.
- **No Restrictions.** There are no enrollment forms, no age or income requirements, no waiting periods, no eligibility required, no exclusions, covers pre-existing conditions, no claim forms to file, no annual or lifetime limits.
- **Lowest Price.** This program has *Lowest Rx Price Logic* to guarantee that you get the best pricing on prescriptions (Card holders pay the lower of a discount off Average Wholesale Price-AWP, discount off MAC Pricing, or Pharmacy Promotional/Retail price). You can save up to 75% on your medications (average savings are roughly 30%)!
- **Medications.** The program includes discounts on brand and generic medications, open formulary so that all medications are eligible for discounts.
- **Accepted Everywhere.** The Discount Prescription Card is pre-activated and accepted at over 68,000 pharmacies around the country including most major chains.
- **Confidential.** No personal information is required to get a card.

If you do not have a computer or smart phone, ask a friend to download the coupon for you or go to the local library where you can use a computer. Ask a librarian for help, if you need it.

Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program (SPDAP)

The Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program (SPDAP) is a subsidy program established by the Maryland General Assembly in 2005 to provide financial assistance to moderate-income Maryland residents who are eligible for Medicare and are enrolled in a prescription drug plan.

They offer 2 ways for seniors to get assistance with paying for prescriptions and out of pocket costs. The first is called a Premium Subsidy and the other is a Coverage Gap subsidy (for assistance during that time of year when Medicare recipients have a gap in their coverage to pay for their prescriptions).

Eligibility Requirements

To participate in the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program, individuals must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Show residency in Maryland for at least six months
- Be a Medicare recipient
- Have an income at or below 300% of the Federal Poverty Level.

Premium Subsidy

SPDAP will pay up to \$40.00 per month for a member's Medicare Rx prescription drug plan premium, as long as the individual is enrolled in an approved Medicare prescription drug plan or a Medicare Advantage prescription drug plan.

There is an open enrollment period, usually between October and December for the upcoming year.

Coverage Gap (Doughnut Hole) Subsidy

Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program (SPDAP) provides a coverage gap (aka the "Donut Hole") subsidy for eligible members enrolled in a Maryland Medicare Part D prescription drug plan (PDP).

Here is how it works:

As a Medicare Part D recipient, you are responsible for 100% of your prescription drug costs while in the coverage gap, less applicable Federal Drug Discounts and any supplemental coverage offered by your plan. If your total drug costs exceed \$3,700 before the end of the year, you may be eligible for this Coverage Gap Subsidy. The maximum benefit per member for 2016 was \$600.00. For 2017 the maximum benefit increased to \$1,000.00.

To take advantage of this Coverage Gap Subsidy, you will need to provide your December Monthly Prescription Drug Summary Statement, provided by your Medicare Part-D plan. Your submitted statement will indicate your total drug costs for the plan year.

If you do not have drug costs that exceed the initial coverage limit of \$3,700, you should not submit your Benefit Summary Statement. You are not entitled to the coverage gap benefit.

If the total drug costs are above the initial coverage limit of \$3,700, please submit your December Monthly Prescription Drug Summary Statement for review. Members who receive a partial Federal Low-Income Subsidy (LIS), or extra help, are not eligible to receive the coverage gap subsidy.

Your December Monthly Prescription Drug Summary Statement must be received by March 31 to be processed for the previous year Coverage Gap Subsidy benefit. If you are eligible for the Coverage Gap Subsidy, a check will be issued and mailed to you directly from the SPDAP.

Pharmaceutical Assistance Program

Some pharmaceutical companies offer assistance programs for the drugs they manufacture. Medicare has a website where you can look up your medication to see if the drug company has a program to assist with cost of your medication.

Primary Care Health Clinics and Practices

Baltimore Medical Systems (BMS) offers a sliding scale fee program based on the patient's income. If the patient is unemployed, they will evaluate the patient's payment by whatever the source of income; he/she may collect supplemental security income, social security, disability or some other government program. Among the services provided are: Ob/Gyn, Pediatrics, Internal Medicine, Podiatry, Ophthalmology, and Dentistry services.

Free screenings for Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD)

Getting yourself tested for sexually transmitted infections is the first step in taking responsibility for your sexual health and the health of your partners. Get a free test for HIV or other sexually transmitted infections (STIs) at one of the STD clinics in Baltimore.

The Baltimore City Health Department, Bureau of Clinical Services operates two STD Clinics. These clinics provide free and confidential testing, diagnosis and treatment for STIs, including chlamydia, gonorrhea, trichomonas, NGU, syphilis, herpes simplex virus, genital warts (HPV), and HIV. They also provide testing, diagnosis and treatment for yeast infections, bacterial vaginosis, and Hepatitis C. The clinics provide Ryan White primary care services for HIV positive clients along with STI testing.

No appointment necessary, but patients are encouraged to arrive at the clinic at 8:30 a.m. Most services are free. Please contact clinic for details.

Al-Anon and Alateen

What is it?

Al-Anon is a mutual support program for people whose lives have been affected by someone else's drinking in the past or present. By sharing common experiences and applying the Al-Anon principles, families and friends of alcoholics can bring positive changes to their individual situations, whether or not the alcoholic admits the existence of a drinking problem or seeks help. In a typical AL-ANON meeting, participants share and listen to the experiences, strengths and hopes of one another on a confidential and anonymous basis.

Alateen, a part of the Al-Anon Family Groups, is a fellowship of young people (mostly teenagers) whose lives have been affected by someone else's drinking whether they are in your life drinking or not. By attending Alateen, teenagers meet other teenagers with similar situations. Alateen is not a religious program and there are no fees or dues to belong to it.

Mercy Medical Center is a designated treatment center for sexual assault and domestic violence in Baltimore City, with 30 specially trained Forensic Nurse Examiners (FNEs) available 24/7 to care for victims of sexual assault (aged 13 and older), victims of domestic violence, elder/institutional and vulnerable populations abuse, neglect, and maltreatment. The Forensic Nurse Examiner Program works collaboratively with criminal justice agencies and other Baltimore agencies addressing the needs of victims of violence.

The **bMoreSafe** app was developed by the Mercy Medical Center Forensic Nurse Examiner staff to provide quick and easy access (“Help at the Touch of a Button”) to those in the community who are in need of forensic nursing services. The app provides information regarding where to go, who to call and what steps can be taken to preserve evidence prior to a medical forensic exam. Literacy

What is it?

Literacy is more than just the ability to read. It refers to understanding, evaluating, and using the words we read in order to learn and interact with others. Many adults in Baltimore and across the country are affected by low literacy levels, and there are numerous programs available to empower individuals who wish to improve their literacy skills.

Using the Public Library

The Enoch Pratt Free Library has 22 locations in Baltimore City. It is likely that a library branch is located in (or very close to) your neighborhood. The public library offers free services to everyone, including book borrowing, computers, internet access, and copy/printing/fax services.

The Enoch Pratt Free Library also offers school and homework help, a Job and Career Center, Mobile Job Center, and personal assistance from librarians. The Job and Career Center is located at the Central Branch on Cathedral Street. This center provides materials on job hunting, resume writing, interview techniques, career planning, and occupation types. You can also reserve a computer for up to two hours to perform job-related activities, like writing a resume or applying for a job. If the Central Branch is not convenient for you, the Mobile Job Center is available. It looks very similar to the HANDLS MRV! The vehicle has 12 individual computer workstations. Library staff can provide computer assistance, referrals to job and career organizations, and referrals to Adult Basic Education and GED classes. Librarians can also help you sign up for an email address, prepare for job interviews, create a resume, and help you search for a job. The Mobile Job Center stops in the following communities:

Westport/Mt. Winans/Lakeland; Brooklyn/Curtis Bay/Hawkins Point; Greater Rosemont/Mondawmin, Allendale/Irvington/S. Hilton; Old Town/Middle East; Greenmount East; Druid Heights/Penn North/Upton; and Park Heights. Check the library's website to see which day of the week the Mobile Job Center will be in your community.

Additionally, the library offers a wide variety of public events and free classes for all. Examples of classes include basic computer skills and pre-GED. Examples of events include trivia, film viewings, meditation, fitness programs, and entertaining programs for children. To use these services, all you need is a library card. Everyone who lives in Maryland is eligible to sign up for a library card at the Enoch Pratt Free Library. You can apply for a library card online through the library's website, or in-person at a library branch. All you need to provide to apply for a library card is your name, address, phone number, and birth date. With a library card, you can borrow materials such as books, CDs, DVDs, audiobooks, maps, and magazines. Prescription Drug Takeback Program

What is it?

Prescription drug misuse is a serious issue in Baltimore City and across the country. In 2015, 105 people in Baltimore City died of prescription opioid-related overdoses. The same year, 12.5 million people aged 12 or older misused prescription pain relievers nationwide.

Prescription drug takeback programs have been implemented to help people responsibly and anonymously dispose of expired or unused prescriptions (including opioids such as Percocet, OxyContin, or Vicodin). Prescription drug drop boxes are available at all times at Baltimore's nine police district offices in order to prevent heroin overdoses and other accidental drug deaths.

Needle Exchange Programs

What is it?

The Baltimore City Needle Exchange Program (NEP) seeks to reduce HIV, hepatitis C, and other infections by reducing the circulation of unclean syringes. The program also helps individuals with substance use disorders overcome addiction by linking them to drug treatment services. The program provides counseling and testing for HIV and syphilis. Opioid overdose response training is also offered at all locations. NEP services are provided in 16 locations during 26 weekly time slots throughout the city of Baltimore.

The mission of Community Risk Reduction Services is to deliver free and confidential quality HIV prevention and harm reduction education and services in communities within Baltimore City, via mobile and other outreach methods, in a non-judgmental manner that reduces the negative consequences of drug use among high-risk individuals and the general public.
