Introduction

The purpose of this referral guide is to offer a list of health care providers and health care facilities that provide the outpatient medical services you may need for medical follow-up care outside of your participation in the HANDLS study. It describes non-profit and governmental resources available to provide services to individuals with health insurance, medical assistance, lower income, and/or uninsured residents of the Baltimore area. The guide is not intended to list all available programs, but rather *major* programs that provide primary health care, pharmacy assistance, hotlines, HIV screening, literacy/GED programs, mental health and substance abuse treatment programs. Some of the programs listed will accept Medicare, medical assistance and/or private insurance.

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Getting Health Insurance Benefits

What is Maryland Health Connection?

Maryland Health Connection is for all Marylanders who need health insurance. It is Maryland's official health insurance marketplace where you can shop, compare and enroll in quality health and dental insurance that fits your needs and your budget.

What makes coverage through Maryland Health Connection more affordable?

Maryland Health Connection is the only place you can get financial help to lower the cost of health insurance. Nine in 10 Marylanders who enrolled last year qualified for financial help. Depending on your income and family size, you may qualify for tax credits that lower your monthly premium and for lower out-of-pocket costs like deductibles and copays. Or, you may qualify for free or low-cost coverage through Medicaid or Maryland Children's Health Program. Check out the chart below to see what you might qualify for. If you're pregnant or you have children, you may still qualify even if your income is higher.

Am I required to have health insurance?

Under federal law, it is no longer required to provide proof of health insurance, however it is important to have in case of medical emergencies, in order to not have to pay the rising costs of healthcare.

For now, here's what you need to know:

- The recent reduction in federal funding for the federal navigator program does not pertain to Maryland. Maryland Health Connection is a state-based marketplace. Therefore, the funding that supports our navigator program has been maintained for navigators, who provide help for enrollment into free and low-cost health coverage and private health plans.
- Open enrollment is from Nov. 1-Jan. 15. Enroll Nov. 1-Dec. 31 for coverage beginning Jan. 1. Enroll Jan. 1-15 for coverage beginning Feb. 1. You can enroll in health coverage any time of year if you qualify for Medicaid or the Maryland Children's Health Program (MCHP). Certain life events qualify you to enroll in a health plan outside of open enrollment. Nine out of 10 people who enrolled qualified for lower costs.
- Even if you're already enrolled, it's more important to go back each year to browse plan prices to make sure you're getting the best deal for you and your family.
- Most Marylanders receiving financial help will not see an increase in their monthly costs, even if their plan's premium went up this year. In fact, some people who previously would not have qualified for financial help will now qualify for a tax credit to help lower their costs.
- While you will no longer receive a fine if you do not have health insurance, it is important to have it to prevent you from incurring the high costs of healthcare yourself.
- Make sure you stay covered throughout the year by continuing to pay your premium on time.

- Maryland Health Connection continues to help eligible people enroll year-round including those
 who have recently experienced certain life events like losing their job, getting married or divorced, or
 having a baby.
- If you are eligible for Medicaid or Maryland Children's Health Insurance Program (MCHP), you can enroll any time.

How to enroll for health insurance coverage

Maryland Health Connection is designed to help you find health insurance that meets your needs and fits your budget. You may be eligible for financial help that can lower your monthly premium for free or low-cost coverage through Medicaid. To find out you will need to apply through Maryland Health Connection. You must apply during the open enrollment. **Open enrollment for health and dental plans begins Nov. 1 and ends Jan. 15.**

What documents will I need to apply:

Use the checklist below to get ready to apply:

- Social Security numbers (or document numbers for any legal immigrants who need insurance)
- Birthdates and general information about you and your family members who are also applying for health coverage
- Tax returns from previous years
- Policy numbers for any current health insurance
- Employer and income information for everyone in your family (for example, from paystubs, W-2 forms or wage and tax statements)

Information about any job-related health insurance available to your family

Having these documents available will make the process go much quicker. Be prepared by having them nearby when you complete your application.

* Remember if you have a qualifying life event or if you are eligible for Medicaid, you can apply anytime

MARYLAND ACCESS POINT:

MAP is the "one-stop-shop" for information and assistance. With a single call, older adults, adults with disabilities and their caregivers can learn about and apply for resources available to them. Individuals will receive information and assistance with a wide range of services that includes screening for federal and state benefits, assisted living support, legal aid, Medicare enrollment, caregiver support, meals, medication management, transportation, and dealing with issues like Alzheimer's, dementia, and chronic diseases. There are over 20 MAP sites across Maryland for individuals who prefer to get face-to-face counseling on their options.

Pharmacy Assistance in Maryland

Below are a several ways to get assistance paying for prescriptions in Maryland that are not covered by your health insurance plan, Medicare part D and/or Medicaid.

Maryland Prescription Plan – Prescription Assistance Program (PAP)

As a resident of Maryland, you and your family have access to a statewide Prescription Assistance Program (PAP). Create and print your discount prescription drug card coupon here:

https://www.marylandrxcard.com/. This pharmacy coupon card will provide you with Rx medication savings of up to 80% at more than 68,000 pharmacies across the country including CVS/pharmacy, Albertsons, Walgreens, Stop & Shop, Giant, Safeway, Rite Aid, Kmart, and many more. You can create as many coupons as you need. You can create and send them to friends and family members via one of the many available options. This Coupon/Card is pre-activated and can be used immediately!

- <u>Free For Everyone.</u> All residents are eligible to get pharmacy discounts through this program. The program may be used to provide savings on prescriptions not covered by your health insurance or Medicare Part D. The program may also be used instead of your insurance coverage when it offers greater savings than your copay.
- <u>No Restrictions.</u> There are no enrollment forms, no age or income requirements, no waiting periods, no eligibility required, no exclusions, covers pre-existing conditions, no claim forms to file, no annual or lifetime limits.
- <u>Lowest Price</u>. This program has *Lowest Rx Price Logic* to guarantee that you get the best pricing on prescriptions (Card holders pay the lower of a discount off Average Wholesale Price-AWP, discount off MAC Pricing, or Pharmacy Promotional/Retail price). You can save up to 80% on your medications (average savings are roughly 30%)!
- <u>Medications.</u> The program includes discounts on brand and generic medications, open formulary so that all medications are eligible for discounts.
- Accepted Everywhere. The Discount Prescription Card is pre-activated and accepted at over 68,000 pharmacies around the country including most major chains.
- Confidential. No personal information is required to get a card.

If you do not have a computer or smart phone, ask a friend to download the coupon for you or go to the local library where you can use a computer. Ask a librarian for help if you need it.

Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program (SPDAP)

The Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program (SPDAP) is a subsidy program established by the Maryland General Assembly in 2005 to provide financial assistance to moderate-income Maryland residents who are eligible for Medicare and are enrolled in a prescription drug plan.

They offer 2 ways for seniors to get assistance with paying for prescriptions and out of pocket costs. The first is called a Premium Subsidy and the other is a Coverage Gap subsidy (for assistance during that time of year when Medicare recipients have a gap in their coverage to pay for their prescriptions) (Unavailable for 2023).

Eligibility Requirements

To participate in the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program, individuals must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Show residency in Maryland for at least six months
- Be a Medicare recipient
- Have an income at or below 300% of the Federal Poverty Level.

Premium Subsidy

- SPDAP will pay up to \$60.00 per month for a member's Medicare Rx prescription drug plan premium, as long as the individual is enrolled in an approved Medicare prescription drug plan or a Medicare Advantage prescription drug plan.
- Please note, for CY 2023 there will not be an SPDAP Coverage Gap (Donut Hole) subsidy.
- There is an open enrollment period, usually between October and December for the upcoming year.

Coverage Gap (Doughnut Hole) Subsidy

 Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program (SPDAP) provides a coverage gap (aka the "Donut Hole") subsidy for eligible members enrolled in a Maryland Medicare Part D prescription drug plan (PDP). This subsidy will not be available for 2023.

Pharmaceutical Assistance Program

Some pharmaceutical companies offer assistance programs for the drugs they manufacture. Medicare has a website where you can look up your medication to see if the drug company has a program to assist with cost of your medication.

Click on the first letter of your drug name to see if any programs are available for the drugs you are taking. If your drug is on the list, click on "details" for detailed information about the program.

Primary Care Health Clinics and Practices

Baltimore Medical Systems (BMS) offers a sliding scale fee program based on the patient's income. If the patient is unemployed, they will evaluate the patient's payment by whatever the source of income; he/she may collect supplemental security income, social security, disability, or some other government program. Among the services provided are: Ob/Gyn, Pediatrics, Internal Medicine, Podiatry, Ophthalmology, Dentistry services, Behavioral Health, Substance Use Treatment, On-site Pharmacy, and same day appointments. BMS also provides FREE COVID home testing kits while supplies last and provide COVID vaccinations (Moderna and Pfizer). BMS has health benefit advisors to help you determine if you apply for free or low-cost programs, and if you are uninsured, they can help you apply for medical coverage.

BMS also has pharmacies located in each of the centers that accept most prescription plans, medical assistance plans and discount programs. These programs can cut your medication costs or give them to you for free if you qualify. They can help you apply for these discount programs.

BMS also provides FREE delivery to our patients who live or work in certain ZIP codes. You can call in your prescription refills 24 hours per day.

Family Health Centers of Baltimore (FHCB) is a not-for-profit health center, providing primary care services at 2 locations in the Baltimore area. FHCB provides primary care, mental health, substance abuse, and OB/GYN services. FHCB offers a sliding scale fee program, which depends on the patient's income, and is available for people without health insurance. To qualify, bring proof of family size and income, and your fees could be drastically reduced. Patients who are unemployed can meet with a social worker to discuss eligibility for insurance plans. Case management services at FHCB can also help find resources for patients, including housing and food resources.

Also located at this location is Grace Medical Center which provides hospitalization, inpatient and outpatient behavioral health, and emergency services. Grace Medical Center accepts most major insurance providers, including Medicare and Medicaid. They also accept all private pay patients. Before scheduling an appointment or seeking treatment, please contact your insurance provider to verify full coverage.

Grace Medical Center, through Lifebridge Health Hospitals, can provide financial assistance, including discounts, to financially disadvantaged patients (including the uninsured or underinsured) who qualify. Patients and families with an annual income of up to 300% of the Federal Poverty Level may qualify for discounts up to 100% of their hospital bill. You may be eligible for Financial Hardship Reduced Cost Care if your income is between 301% - 500%.

Mercy Personal Physicians

Mercy offers primary care doctors as well as specialists for patients that work or live in and around Baltimore. Most private insurances accepted, including Medicare and Medicaid, however, patients should confirm coverage directly with their insurance carrier and physician's office prior to a visit.

Mercy offers patients financial assistance for those who are uninsured and ineligible for federal medical assistance. Payment plans are available and/or a patient can be put on a sliding scale which would allow a percentage of assistance depending on their eligibility under current guidelines. To qualify for Financial Assistance, a patient must be a Maryland resident and have a family income at or below 400% of the Federal Poverty Level and cannot be eligible for Medicaid or other social service programs. Park West Medical Center is a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) that offers general internal medicine. Ob/Gyn, pediatrics, dentistry (Belvedere location only), women's health, pharmacy. They accent most insurances and patients may also qualify for additional discounts. The Sliding Scale Fee Program, which depends on the patient's income and family size. If the patient is unemployed, they will evaluate the patient's payment by whatever source of income, he/she may collect, i.e., SSI, social security, etc.

Free screenings for Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD)

Getting yourself tested for sexually transmitted infections is the first step in taking responsibility for your sexual health and the health of your partners. Get a free test for HIV or other sexually transmitted infections (STIs) at one of the STD clinics in Baltimore.

The Baltimore City Health Department, Bureau of Clinical Services operates two STD Clinics. These clinics provide free and confidential testing, diagnosis, and treatment for STIs, including chlamydia, gonorrhea, trichomonas, non-gonococcal urethritis, syphilis, herpes simplex virus, genital warts (HPV), and HIV. They also provide testing, diagnosis and treatment for yeast infections, bacterial vaginosis, and Hepatitis C. The clinics provide Ryan White primary care services for HIV positive clients along with STI testing.

No appointment necessary, but patients are encouraged to arrive at the clinic at 8:30 a.m. Most services are free. Please contact clinic for details.

- Share the card with friends and family
- Use the card as often as needed
- · Free, no fees or registration
- Never expires

What if I have insurance?

Anyone can use the card, but it can't be combined with insurance.

You can use the card instead of insurance if:

- A drug isn't covered by your insurance
- Your insurance has no drug coverage
- You have a high drug deductible
- You have met a low medicine cap
- The card offers a better price than your copay
- You are in the Medicare Part D donut hole

What drugs are covered?

The card is good for prescription drugs, over-the-counter medicines and medical supplies if written on a prescription blank, and pet prescription medicines purchased at a pharmacy. You'll save on most, but not all, prescriptions.

The card is not valid in combination with other insurance plans, including Medicare, Medicaid or any state or federal prescription insurance. The card can be used only if you decide not to use your government-sponsored drug plan for your purchases.

- How does it work?
 - Every day a telephone call will be placed to a participant at a regularly scheduled time. These calls will take place between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. as close as possible to the one-hour time block pre-selected by the participant. If the participant does not answer their first call, they will be tried two more times. If those calls go unanswered, additional calls will be made to notify an alternative person who is selected by the participant during program enrollment. This could be an adult child, a neighbor, a loved one, or we will assign an alternate for you. The alternate will then be encouraged to check on the older adult program participant. The failure of the participant and alternate to answer will result in a call to your local non-emergency service.

Using the Public Library

The Enoch Pratt Free Library has 22 locations in Baltimore City. It is likely that a library branch is located in (or very close to) your neighborhood. The public library offers free services to everyone, including book borrowing, computers, internet access, and copy/printing/fax services.

The Enoch Pratt Free Library also offers school and homework help, a Job and Career Center, Mobile Job Center, and personal assistance from librarians. The Job and Career Center is located at the Central Branch on Cathedral Street. This center provides materials on job hunting, resume writing, interview techniques, career planning, and occupation types. You can also reserve a computer for up to two hours to perform job-related activities, like writing a resume or applying for a job. If the Central Branch is not convenient for you, the Mobile Job Center is available. It looks very similar to the HANDLS MRV! The vehicle has 12 individual computer workstations. Library staff can provide computer assistance, referrals to job and career organizations, and referrals to Adult Basic Education and GED classes. Librarians can also help you sign up for an email address, prepare for job interviews, create a resume, and help you search for a job. The Mobile Job Center stops in the following communities:

Westport/Mt.Winans/Lakeland; Brooklyn/Curtis Bay/Hawkins Point; Greater Rosemont/Mondawmin, Allendale/Irvington/S. Hilton; Old Town/Middle East; Greenmount East; Druid Heights/Penn North/Upton; and Park Heights. Check the library's website to see which day of the week the Mobile Job Center will be in your community.

Additionally, the library offers a wide variety of public events and free classes for all. Examples of classes include basic computer skills and pre-GED. Examples of events include trivia, film viewings, meditation, fitness programs, and entertaining programs for children. To use these services, all you need is a library

card. Everyone who lives in Maryland is eligible to sign up for a library card at the Enoch Pratt Free Library. You can apply for a library card online through the library's website, or in-person at a library branch. All you need to provide to apply for a library card is your name, address, phone number, and birth date. With a library card, you can borrow materials such as books, CDs, DVDs, audiobooks, maps, and magazines. Prescription Drug Takeback Program

What is it?

Prescription drug misuse is a serious issue in Baltimore City and across the country. In 2015, 105 people in Baltimore City died of prescription opioid-related overdoses. The same year, 12.5 million people aged 12 or older misused prescription pain relievers nationwide.

Prescription drug takeback programs have been implemented to help people responsibly and anonymously dispose of expired or unused prescriptions (including opioids such as Percocet, OxyContin, or Vicodin). Prescription drug drop boxes are available at all times at Baltimore's nine police district offices in order to prevent heroin overdoses and other accidental drug deaths.

Needle Exchange Programs

What is it?

The Baltimore City Needle Exchange Program (NEP) seeks to reduce HIV, hepatitis C, and other infections by reducing the circulation of unclean syringes. The program also helps individuals with substance use disorders overcome addiction by linking them to drug treatment services. The program provides counseling and testing for HIV and syphilis. Opioid overdose response training is also offered at all locations. NEP services are provided in 16 locations during 26 weekly time slots throughout the city of Baltimore.

The mission of Community Risk Reduction Services is to deliver free and confidential quality HIV prevention and harm reduction education and services in communities within Baltimore City, via mobile and other outreach methods, in a non-judgmental manner that reduces the negative consequences of drug use among high-risk individuals and the general public.
